#### **Course Description:**

Continued exploration in make-up, wig making and styling technique. This two semester course introduces students to a wider variety of materials and techniques including commonly used 3-dimensional applications to create complete characters. Prerequisite: DEP 2712

#### **Required Material:**

Fully stocked Make-up and Hair Kit Camera

**Note:** All materials and supplies are required for all class periods and need to be accessible in the classroom

## **Required Research Material and Written Paper:**

Find at least 3 pictures showing the make-up topic, the research is due on the day indicated in the calendar and need to be delivered a digital form clearly organized in folders

### **Goals and Objectives:**

You will continue to explore more make-up techniques through various Make-up exercises starting to incorporate 3 dimensional techniques

You will continue focusing on full character development.

Hair, Make-up exercises and demonstrations will include:

- Machine made wig foundations
- Fringe construction
- Fabricating and applying Bald Caps

- Period Make-up 1780
- Latex aging techniques

Upon successful completion of this term, students will demonstrate clear understanding in.

- Building wig foundations using sewing machines
- Shaping a face with highlight and shadow
- period wig styling and make-up techniques
- Male balding patterns

It is understood that the final Wig and Make-up exercises encompasses the full character (Make-up, Hair, Costume)

F= No attempt at the assignment. There is no sign of class participation. The project is barely started with no technical or artistic understanding.
